Preparation Description

Molluscicide containing glycosides for use as a ready to use biocide.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Inhalation

If inhaled, remove affected person from contaminated area. Apply artificial respiration if not breathing. Seek medical attention.

Ingestion

Do not induce vomiting. Wash out mouth thoroughly with water. Seek immediate medical attention.

Skin

Remove all contaminated clothing immediately. Wash affected area thoroughly with soap and water. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse or discard. Seek medical attention.

Eye

If in eyes, hold eyelids apart and flush the eyes continuously with running water. Remove contact lenses. Continue flushing for several minutes until all contaminants are washed out completely. Seek medical attention.

First-aid Facilities

Section 5 - Firefighting Measures

Suitable Extinguishing Media

Water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, carbon dioxide or dry chemical.

Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures

Emergency Procedures

Wear appropriate personal protective equipment and clothing to prevent exposure. Increase ventilation. If possible contain the spill. Place inert absorbent material onto spillage. Collect the material and place into a suitable labelled container. As a water based product, if spilt on electrical equipment the product will cause short-circuits. Do not dilute material but contain. Prevent this material entering waterways, drains and sewers. Dispose of waste according to the applicable local and national regulations. If contamination of sewers or waterways occurs inform the local water and waste management authorities in accordance with local regulations.

Section 7 - Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling

Keep out of the reach of children. Avoid inhalation of vapours and mists, and skin or eye contact. Avoid breathing spray. Use only in a well ventilated area. Keep containers sealed when not in use. Prevent the build up of mists or vapours in the work atmosphere. Maintain high standards of personal hygiene i.e. washing hands prior to eating, drinking, smoking or using toilet facilities. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, out of direct sunlight. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs. Protect from freezing. Store in sealed or original containers. Do not store in unlabelled containers. Keep containers tightly closed. Store away from incompatible materials. Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Ensure that storage conditions comply with applicable local and national regulations.

Disposal Considerations

The disposal of the spilled or waste material must be done in accordance with applicable local and national regulations. Do not re-use container.

Product Disposal:

Product wastes are controlled wastes and should be disposed of in accordance with all applicable local and national regulations. This product can be disposed through a licensed commercial waste collection service. In this specific case the product is water-based/water-soluble and therefore can be sent through a Waste Water Treatment Plant and after treatment can be discharged into environment through the sewerage or drainage systems as authorized.

Personal protective clothing and equipment as specified in Section 8 of this SDS must be worn during handling and disposal of this product.
